The Lions Gate Scroll

A Rite of Alignment in the Mystery School of Tehuti

Prologue

Let the reader understand: the Portal of the Lions is not a date upon the common calendar, but an eternal threshold that returns each solar year. It is a marriage of the Sun in his leonine power and the Star of the Goddess Sopdet, whose light descends from the higher realms. This scroll is given that the initiate may walk the path of equilibrium, receiving the divine measure in purity and in truth.

Preparation of the Temple

On the eve before the rising of Sirius:

1. Sanctify the Space

Purify your chamber or chosen place beneath the open sky. Wash the space with pure water and, if possible, sprinkle with natron or sea salt, intoning:

"By the waters of the primeval flood, may all be made pure before the Neteru."

2. Symbols and Implements

- Two lions, facing opposite directions, or drawn upon parchment representing the Akeru, the guardians of the gate.
- o A white candle (for Sirius) and a gold candle (for the Sun).
- A scroll or blank paper upon which you will inscribe the wisdom received.
- The ankh, the sign of life; place it at the center.

3. Alignment with the Heavens

If possible, orient your altar toward the place of Sirius's rising in the east. This is the direction of the opening.

The Dawn Rite

At the first light of the 8th of August (or the day of Sirius's rising in your land):

1. The Opening Invocation

Stand between the two lions, whether statues or symbolic. Face the east.

Speak aloud:

"I stand at the Gate of the Lions, between past and future, between shadow and light.

O Sopdet, Star of the Great Returning, O Ra in the House of Leo,

O Tehuti, Lord of the Divine Word and Measure, open unto me the portal, that the writing of heaven be inscribed upon my heart."

2. The Attunement

- Light the white candle for Sirius, saying:
 "Star of the Goddess, descend with your light."
- Light the gold candle for the Sun, saying:
 "Solar Lion, rise with your power."
- Close your eyes and visualize a radiant shaft of light descending from Sirius through the crown of your head, meeting the solar fire in your heart.

3. The Silent Receiving

In perfect stillness, remain for seven minutes. Let the union of these two lights speak within you. Do not force vision or word; allow Tehuti, as scribe, to inscribe in your inner temple.

The Inscription

When the seven minutes have passed:

- Take your scroll or paper and, without judgment or reasoning, record the impressions, symbols, or words that arise.
- This is the "Writing of the Lions Gate", a message from the higher realms for the cycle ahead.
- Seal it with the sign of the ankh at the bottom.

The Closing

- Give thanks to Sopdet, to Ra, and to Tehuti, saying:
 "The Gate is closed; the Light remains within."
- Extinguish the candles in reverse order, gold, then white.
- Keep your scroll for the year; revisit it at the next rising of Sirius to measure your journey.

Epilogue

Thus is the rite of the Lions Gate in the tradition of Tehuti, who measures the heavens and inscribes the eternal upon the heart of the initiate. Perform it with purity, and you shall pass between the lions in strength and in truth.
